Important reminder! Abstracts open until 15 October, 2024, for 5th ISA Forum, Rabat, Morocco (July 2025)

Abstracts are now open for the 5th ISA Forum in Rabat, Morocco, 6-11 July 2025. The Research Committee on Labour Movements (RC44) will have 18 sessions at next year's ISA Forum to choose from – see here for full selection. We encourage members to submit abstracts for these sessions. The Call for Abstracts is open until 15 October 2024. For more information on how to submit your abstract, please read see the information below. Please also note that the conference is in-person only—there will be no online or hybrid sessions. Key Points for Submission

For submitting your abstract, you should prepare:

- 1. Title
- 2. **Keywords** Up to four custom keywords.
- 3. **Author(s)** Presenting author and any co-authors. There is a limit of seven (7) authors.
- 4. **Abstract** Abstract text may not exceed 300 words and can be entered in either English, French or Spanish. Please review the languages accepted in the session you want to submit for.

- Abstracts Submission Closes: October 15, 2024 No deadline extensions.
- Abstracts Selection Closes: November 10, 2024
- Abstract Relocation Closes: November 30, 2024
- Notification of Acceptance: December 5, 2024

Rules for all presenters

- All abstracts must be submitted in English, French or Spanish. Please review the languages accepted in the session you want to submit for.
- There is a limit of seven (7) authors per abstract.
- Authors and co-authors cannot present and chair in the same session. Please note that session organizer and chair does not need to be the same person.
