


News From Clinical Sociologists Around the World

News from Fernando de Yzaguirre

This book is the first compendium in Spanish dedicated to clinical sociology, an innovative current that underlines the importance of the human and social sciences in understanding the subject from a close perspective and opening paths towards their emancipation. With an accessible and rigorous approach, the book addresses the essential dimensions of clinical sociology, linking it with key currents such as comprehensive sociology, sociological social psychology, the critical theory of the Frankfurt School, symbolic interactionism, psychoanalysis, phenomenology, pragmatism and participatory action research (PAR). This journey is complemented by a historical analysis of clinical sociology in France, the USA and Canada (Quebec), together with concrete examples of its development in Latin America and Spain, particularly in Colombia, the country of origin of this work. The second part examines in depth the epistemological framework that supports clinical sociology and sets out its specific proposals in this field. Anchored in the critical hermeneuticinterpretive paradigm and based on epistemologies of reception, historicity and transformative appropriation, the socioclinical perspective is oriented towards the deep understanding and transformation of complex social realities such as organizations, education, health, delinquency and suicide.





The work, which integrates theory and practice, is presented as an essential reference for students, researchers and professionals in the human, social and health sciences, interested in carrying out psychosocial interventions with a humanistic approach focused on the subject. The prologue was written by the president of the International Network of Clinical Sociology (RISC), Vincent de Gaulejac.

Esta obra constituye el primer compendio en español dedicado a la sociología clínica, una corriente innovadora que subraya la importancia de las ciencias humanas y sociales para comprender al sujeto desde la proximidad y abrir vías

hacia su emancipación. Con un enfoque accesible y riguroso, el libro aborda las dimensiones esenciales de la sociología clínica, vinculándola con corrientes clave como la sociología comprensiva, la psicología social sociológica, la teoría crítica de la Escuela de Frankfurt, el interaccionismo simbólico, el psicoanálisis, la fenomenología, el pragmatismo y la investigación-acción participativa (IAP). Este recorrido se complementa con un análisis histórico de la sociología clínica en Francia, EE.UU. y Canadá (Quebec), junto con ejemplos concretos de su desarrollo en Latinoamérica y España, particularmente en Colombia, país de origen de esta obra. En la segunda parte se examina en profundidad el marco epistemológico que sustenta la sociología clínica y se exponen sus propuestas específicas en este ámbito.

Anclada en el paradigma hermenéutico-interpretativo crítico y fundamentada en epistemologías de la recepción, la historicidad y la apropiación transformadora, la perspectiva socioclínica se orienta a la comprensión profunda y transformación de realidades sociales complejas tales como las



organizaciones, la educación, la salud, la delincuencia y el suicidio.

El trabajo, que integra teoría y práctica, se presenta como una referencia esencial para estudiantes, investigadores y profesionales de las ciencias humanas, sociales y de la salud, interesados en realizar intervenciones psicosociales con un abordaje humanista centrado en el sujeto.
